Drought Management

- Currently in Stage II water restrictions per JBSA Drought Management Plan
- Lawn and landscape watering on designated day during hours 0300-0800 (3am - 8 am) and 2000-2200 (8 pm - 10 pm)
- GOV washing twice/month. POV washing on designated watering day
- JBSA Stage III restrictions begin when Bexar J-17 index well falls to 650 feet and 502 ABW initiates additional restrictions
- JBSA Drought Stages differ from SAWS; ensure you follow JBSA restrictions

West Nile Virus

- Fogging continues in targeted areas within JBSA-Camp Bullis. Continuing to treat pools of water at JBSA-FSH and JBSA-CB.

JBSA-Camp Bullis Hunting Season (as training schedule allows)

- Archery Season (Deer) underway
- Gun Season (Deer) starts 3 November 12

Qualified Recycling Program (QRP)

- In FY12, JBSA-FSH diverted 12.53% of waste from landfills, compared to 10.15% in FY11
- Recycling generated \$155K in proceeds in FY12 that will be put back into the recycling program to purchase additional recycling equipment and expand the program
- Federal requirement is to divert 50% of waste by 30 Sep 2015



Hazardous Material Management Program (HMMP)

- Program manages procurement of hazardous materials to comply with Federal and State laws and regulations
- Works to minimize HAZMAT use by tracking “cradle-to-grave”
- Intended to protect health and the environment from adverse impacts resulting from HAZMAT use
- JBSA-FSH has seen dramatically increased involvement over the last year, but still only 30% of the requirement

Project Updates

- **Johnson Track Lighting:** Construction in progress. ECD 15 Nov 2012.
- **Harry Wurzbach/Stanley Rd Intersection:** Roadway and concrete curbs 75% complete. Waiting arrival of traffic light poles for Harry Wurzbach/Scott Rd and Harry Wurzbach/Stanley Rd intersections. ECD 5 Jan 2013.
- **Scott Rd VCC:** Framing, parking lot grading, and electrical/mechanical rough-ins and communication lines under construction. ECD 28 Feb 2013.
- **Binz-Engleman ECP:** Project awarded 30 Sep 2012. Scope includes gate house, canopy, over watch booth, final denial barriers, and inspection stations. ECD 31 Oct 2013.
- **Scott Rd/N Walters ECP:** Scott/Wilson intersection and ECP started closing nightly (1900-0500) on 27 Sep 2012 and will continue through 22 Oct 2012. Closure is required to conduct Active Vehicle Barrier (AVB) testing and certification. Detour will be via Jadwin Rd ECP. There will be second overnight (1900-0500) closure 1-6 Nov 2012.


