Camp Bullis Prescribed Burns underway. Two burns completed and more burns being scheduled as weather allows.

Camp Bullis Endangered Species seasonal training restrictions began 01 Mar 12. Restrictions limit light, noise, and smoke production in and 100m around occupied Golden-cheeked Warbler habitat.

Camp Bullis Hunting continues. White-tailed deer and the first exotic seasons have ended. Turkey season begins 17 Mar 12.

Earth Day 2012 will be 22 Apr 12. Watch the News Leader for event announcements including an environmental booth at Fiesta, tree plantings, and partnering with Lackland AFB and Randolph AFB events.

Project Updates

- Outdoor Fitness & Training Center. Four new softball and soccer/football fields with a jogging trail along outside of fields to be constructed. Project is delayed due to UXO. Revised completion date is pending.
- Johnson Track and Salado Creek Training Area Lighting. Delayed due to CPS revisions to design. Revised start date is pending.
- Harry Wurzbach/Stanley Rd Intersection Traffic Light Replacement. 95% design review completed. Waiting 100% design to start construction.
- Staff Post Fencing. Construction started 27 Feb 12.
- Scott Rd ECP. Closed 1800, Fri 23 Mar 12 thru 1600, Sun 25 Mar 12 for canopy relocation. Scott Rd/Wilson Way intersection to open 15 May 12. Currently in the most inconvenient stage of construction; situation will improve approximately 01 Apr 12 and continue to improve in steps through completion.
- CoSA Walters St Project. Delayed by rain. Western lanes to be completed and all traffic will be moved onto new lanes approximately 06 Apr 12. Project completion date will be extended to approximately 31 Aug 12.

CoSA Binz-Engleman Rd/Salado Creek Bridge Replacement


- Project has been delayed by recent rains. The remaining work falls into two basic phases:
 - Phase One. The bridge is scheduled to complete NLT 30 Apr 12, weather permitting. Temporary asphalt will be laid and a traffic diversion set up (yellow lines on slide) to allow new bridge to be connected to Schofield Rd (red lines on slide). Upon completion, traffic will be diverted onto the bridge permanently to allow the second phase of the project to start and temporary asphalt removed.
 - Phase Two. Tie in new pavement to the south end of Nursery Rd (formerly S-33). This will start immediately following the bridge opening and is expected to complete NLT 30 Jun 12.
- CoSA contractor requires a one day closure of the Schofield Rd ECP to stripe the Phase One new asphalt. This will occur Saturday, 24 Mar 12. Access to installation via Williams Rd will be open.
- Perimeter fence being moved approximately 15 ft to clear the area for construction of the diversion.



- All military branches have experienced a growing problem with “**designer drugs**”
- The drugs have names like Spice, Bath Salts, Plant Food, 25i, Fizz, Molly, Trance, MXE
- The chemical compounds in the drugs are always changing in order to avoid the DEA’s Controlled Substance Schedules
- These drugs are difficult to test for, but UA samples can be sent to USACIL and AFMES

- How the military is responding to these new drugs:
 - Air Force: AFI 44-121, para 3.2.3
 - Prohibits possession/use of mood altering substances
 - Navy: SECNAVINST 5300.28E, encl 4
 - Prohibits distribution/possession/use of substances having stimulant, depressive, or hallucinogenic effects
 - Army: General Orders vary by command
 - Any drug containing a chemical compound on a Controlled Substance Schedule will be prosecuted under Art 112a, UCMJ

Apheresis Platelet Donors Needed!

- ❖ Constant requirement for burn trauma, surgical, HEM/ONC, NICU patients
- ❖ Mission: 100 units per month
- ❖ Product has a shelf life of 5 days; takes about 90 minutes to collect a single unit
- ❖ \$650.00 product if a donor does not show up for his/her appointment
- ❖ Need more permanent party involvement to cover cancellations/no show

Concerns - No Shows and Cancellations of blood drives/platelet appointments:

- ❖ BDC leadership cannot maximize blood donor resources (personnel, donations, etc.) to the maximum extent possible
- ❖ **Blood drives MUST be put onto the unit's training calendar**
- ❖ Could potentially cause a shortage of blood/blood products at SAMMC
- ❖ CENTCOM tasking – will not be able to support SAMMC and CENTCOM with the current level of participation
- ❖ BDC is available to assist command teams in the planning of blood drives and offer assistance to increase participation
- ❖ Commanders will support and encourage service members and civilian personnel to voluntarily donate (IAW service regulations)
- ❖ A commander's incentives to donate blood (i.e., time off awards)

"We view ourselves on the eve of battle. We are nerved for the contest, and must conquer or perish. It is vain to look for present aid: none is at hand. We must now act or abandon all hope! Rally to the standard, and be no longer the scoff of mercenary tongues! Be men, be free men, that your children may bless their father's name."
