Drought Management

Project Updates

- Camp Bullis Recreation Center Repairs. Asbestos removal to start upon State approval. Drainage and roofing work to follow May-June 2012.
- CPL Johnson Rd will be closed just west of Garden Rd 25 May-25 June 2012 for construction of a new communications manhole. (See drawing)
- Scott Rd ECP. Current detour extended through 09 Jun 2012. Developing detour plan to allow the entire Wilson Way/Scott Rd intersection to be paved and will publicize once complete. New lanes and ID checkpoint to open approx 15 June 2012. Waiting new Walters St schedule from CoSA.

BBQ Grill Fire Safety

- Grills are prohibited inside buildings. Grills are prohibited on balconies above the first floor of any building or structure used for habitation.
- Use grills only on level surfaces in open areas away from buildings, dry leaves, brush, low-hanging trees, deck railings, or other combustible materials. Be aware of windblown sparks.
- It's always a good idea to keep a fire extinguisher within handy reach.
- Do not wear loose clothing. Watch for dangling apron strings and shirt tails.
- Use long handled barbecue tools and flame retardant mitts.
- Do not leave children or pets unattended near a hot grill
- Do not use gasoline or kerosene to start the fire.
- After using starter fluid, cap the container and move it away from the fire.
- Do not add any type of starter fluid once the coals are burning.

BBQ Grill Fire Safety (cont)

- To stop flare-ups, move cooking grid up and spread out the coals.
- Allow coals to burn out completely and let ashes cool for 48 hours before disposing properly.
- If you must dispose of the ashes before fully cooled, soak them completely in water before putting them in a non-combustible container.
- To dispose of the ashes, wrap in foil and put them in an empty non-combustible container.
- **STOP DUMPSTER FIRES. Do not dispose of coals/ashes in dumpsters/trash receptacles.**

IN CASE OF BBQ GRILL FIRE

- PROPANE Grills: Turn off the burners. If you can safely reach the tank valve, shut it off. Close the grill lid.
- CHARCOAL Grills: Close the grill lid.
- ELECTRIC Grills: Disconnect the power. Close the grill lid.
- If the fire involves the propane tank, leave it alone, evacuate the area and call the fire department 9-1-1.
- If there is any type of fire that either threatens your personal safety or endangers property, evacuate the area and call the fire department 9-1-1.


To date, \$130,774 has been donated to the fund. We hope to reach \$200,000 plus. Contributions are coming in daily.



Continuing to expand operations:

- ❖ *Blood drives on master training calendar; continuing to compete for non-POI time*
- ❖ Need to get more Cadre, Family members, and DOD Civilians engaged
- ❖ Incentives for service members and DOD Civilians
 - ❖ AR 40-3, 5-2g(1): Unit commanders will— develop and maintain a program of donor motivation and education. The award of time off for “exceptional performance of duty” to military personnel who donate blood is encouraged
 - ❖ Air Force Instruction (AFI) 36-815; Blood Donations. The Air Force encourages its employees to volunteer as blood donors without compensation. An employee should be excused from work without charge to leave for the time necessary to donate blood or blood products, such as platelets or plasma, for recuperation following blood donation...
 - ❖ OPNAVINST 6530.2D: ...These incentives may include the following: personal recognition, citations, newspapers, special meals, special liberty, etc.
 - ❖ BAMC Memo 40-3: Recuperative Time-Off For Civilians. Consistent with mission requirements, DoD civilian employees are encouraged to seek supervisory approval to serve as blood donors and will be excused from work without charge to leave for the time necessary to donate the blood, for recuperation immediately following blood donation, and for necessary travel to and from the donation site. The maximum excusable time will not exceed 4 hours, except in unusual cases.



2011 versus 2012 - (Participation increased 42% between 1st QTR CY11 and CY12)




